I am directed to state by order of the Governor that the Governor has been pleased to approve of the establishment of:

- (i) Home for Women and Girls exposed to moral danger, and
- (ii) a Reception Centre and Court for female vagrants at 8 Stark Road, Lillooah, Howrah.

2. The Governor is also pleased to approve of the transfer of the Rescue Home now located at 45 Lower Circular Road, Calcutta and the Children Court and the House of Detention now at 85 Lower Circular Road to the aforesaid address at Lillooah as soon as possible.

3. The Rescue Home is at present under the administrative control of this Department (vide this Deptt. G.O. No. 1626-S dt. 1.6.'61) and orders intimating the date of its transfer to Lillooah will issue shortly.

4. The Children Court and the House of Detention are now under the administrative control of the Law (Judicial) Deptt. of this Govt. Steps for issuing separate orders transferring the administrative control of the two institutions (viz. the Children Court and the House of Detention) to this Department and to their shifting to Lillooah are under the consideration of that Department. A copy of the orders will be forwarded as soon as received.

5. The number of persons to be accommodated in the institutions at Lillooah are shown in the margin.

6. The Governor has also been pleased to approve of a joint set-up for the aforesaid institutions particulars of which are shown in the enclosed statement. The posts will be eligible for usual allowances as admissible under the rules.

7. All the above mentioned institutions will be under the administrative control of the Home (Social Welfare) Department and Director of Social Welfare, West Bengal will be their Administrative Head. The Administrative Officer-cum-Superintendent as sanctioned in the set-up will be in their immediate charge and will be the drawing and disbursing officer in respect of those institutions.

8. The State Government in the Home (Social Welfare) Department will be the appointing authority of the gazetted post of Administrative Officer-cum-Superintendent of the aforesaid institution and the Director of Social Welfare will be the appointing authority in respect of the non-gazetted staff as per the approved set-up enclosed herewith.

9. Sanction is also hereby accorded to the absorption of the existing staff of the Rescue Home, Children Court and the House of Detention, Calcutta in the set-up in the corresponding scales of pay of the posts they have been holding in their respective institutions. A separate order showing the absorption of the existing staff in new set-up will issue from the Directorate of Social Welfare in due course.

10. Sanction is also hereby accorded by order of the Governor to the following expenditure to be incurred in connection with purchase of a motor vehicle and various articles of furniture required for the aforesaid institution and to the scales of recurring expenditure to be incurred in connection with the maintenance of the institutions.
